



RESOLUTION OF THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF THE CENTER JOINT UNIFIED SCHOOL DISTRICT DIRECTING THE SUPERINTENDENT TO PREPARE, COMPLETE, AND SUBMIT AN APPLICATION FOR QUALIFIED SCHOOL CONSTRUCTION BONDS, AND ENTER INTO AGREEMENTS TO EFFECTUATE THE FINANCING, DESIGN, AND CONSTRUCTION OF THE QUALIFIED PROJECTS.

WITNESSETH:

WHEREAS, the American Recovery and Reinvestment Act of 2009 (ARRA) has been enacted to stimulate the economy by, among other things, creating incentives to finance public school facilities; and

WHEREAS, the Qualified School Construction Bond (QSCB) program, which is part of ARRA, presents the District with an opportunity to finance facilities needs at a very low interest rate; and

WHEREAS, the District proposes to apply for a QSCB allocation pursuant to 26 U.S.C 54F to further the educational goals of the District; and

WHEREAS, the District is a political subdivision of the State of California and, therefore, is an "eligible issuer" as defined in IRS Notice 2009-35; and

WHEREAS, "qualified purpose" is defined in 26 U.S.C 54F and IRS Notice 2009-35 as (1) the construction, rehabilitation, or repair of a public school facility, (2) the acquisition of land on which such a public school facility is to be financed in part by QSCB proceeds, or (3) the acquisition of equipment to be used in such a public school facility that is being financed in part by QSCB proceeds; and

WHEREAS, the District has determined that it is in the best interests of the students, residents, and landowners, and for the orderly financing, design, and construction of the qualified projects to use the QSCB allocation for such qualified purposes as detailed in Exhibit A; and

WHEREAS, the application to receive authorization to issue QSCBs may be submitted to the California Department of Education (the "Department") starting July 6, 2009.

NOW, THEREFORE, THE GOVERNING BOARD OF THE CENTER JOINT UNIFIED SCHOOL DISTRICT HEREBY RESOLVES, DETERMINES AND ORDERS AS FOLLOWS:

- Section 1. The above recitals are all true and correct.
- Section 2. The Board of Trustees hereby authorizes and directs the Superintendent and other officers of the District, jointly and severally, for and in the name of and on behalf of this District, to take any and all actions, including any amendment necessary to Exhibit A, which may be necessary or advisable in their discretion to cause the preparation and filing of an application with the California Department of Education (the "Department") for an approval and allocation under the Department's QSCB program and to execute necessary agreements for the financing with Caldwell Flores Winters, Inc. and other pre-design / construction consultants as may be needed.
- Section 3. The Board of Trustees hereby declares the District's intention to reimburse itself for the cost any qualified purpose incurred prior to issuance of a QSCB from the proceeds of such QSCB when issued.
- Section 4. In connection with the issuance of a QSCB and use of any proceeds, the Board of Trustees directs the Superintendent and other officers of the District, jointly and severally, for and in the name of and on behalf of this District, to take any and all actions which may be necessary or advisable in their discretion to comply with any requirements of the Internal Revenue Service and the Department.
- Section 5. This resolution shall take effect upon adoption.



SUBJECT: Twin Rivers Police Services Proposal

The Twin Rivers Police Department approached our district in June 2009 to discuss the scope and capabilities of their police department. After discussing the services they offer and touring their headquarters, we learned that TRUSD Police Department is a full service police department with numerous capabilities focused on school safety and security. The scope of their services encompasses those previously conducted by our SRO and our Safe Schools Program.

Attached documents include:

- 1. Twin Rivers Police Services Proposal
- 2. Current Memorandum of Understanding for Safe Schools Sheriff
- 3. Pros/Cons related to each of the programs/services

RECOMMENDATION: The CJUSD Board of Trustees approve the Twin Rivers Police Services Proposal and direct district staff to pursue a contractual agreement not to exceed cost of provided proposal.



SERVICE & COST PROPOSAL

One Sworn Police Officer to be assigned as an S.R.O. to the Center Unified School District for the 2009/2010 school year. This Officer would be assigned to work 8 hours per day, Monday – Friday for the 180 day school year. The Officer would also be assigned to work for the duration of the 2010 summer school session. The same Officer would work each day for the school year with the exception of time off for sick or vacation. The Officer would be driving a marked patrol vehicle and be equipped with all standard issue equipment. Vehicle fuel and maintenance would be included in this cost. The Twin Rivers Police Department would take calls for service from the Center District Schools and dispatch the Officer as necessary. A standard contract would be required to be negotiated prior to the initiation of services.

Total Annual Cost \$116,845.00

One Swom Police Officer to be assigned as an S.R.O. to the Center Unified School District as described above. Additionally Twin Rivers District Police Department would provide patrol and emergency response to the Center Unified School District sites 24 hours per day 365 days per year. This service would also include 24 hour monitoring of Center's video surveillance system and alarm systems, in the Twin Rivers Police Dispatch Center. It would be the Center District's expense to deliver and maintain the signal for the video and alarm systems to the Twin Rivers District Police Department. Twin Rivers will provide the monitoring but not the cost of receiving or recording the signals.

Total Annual Cost \$141,300.00

Security at after hours events or activities requiring additional staff (ie: games, dances, etc) The number of Officers to be provided will be agreed upon by both parties prior to the event.

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MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING

OPERATION SAFE SCHOOLS

AGREEMENT BETWEEN THE

SACRAMENTO COUNTY SHERIFF'S DEPARTMENT

AND

CENTER UNIFIED SCHOOL DISTRICT

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1. PARTIER

The parties to this agreement are the Sacramente County Sheriff's Department and the Center Unified School District.

11. PURPOSE

The purpose of this Memorandum of Understanding is to establish and maintain an effective working relationship between the Sacramento Sheriff's Department and Center Unified School District, who, together, have a mutual concern for the safety and well being of the students and staff who attend school within the District. This agreement will provide terms and conditions for the Sacramento Sheriff's Department to provide Deputies for a security position on designated campuses of the Center Unified School District.

III. TERMS AND CONDITIONS

- A. The Sacramento County Sheriff's Department has agreed to provide Center Unified School District with:
 - 1. Off-duty, armed and uniformed Sheriff's Deputies to provide security for designated school campuses within the School District.
 - 2. Che marked patrol vehicle to be used by these selected Deputies. The School District will lease the vehicle from the Sheriff's Department. The cost for the lease of this vehicle is 30 cents per mile and a fixed rate of \$300.00 for the vehicle per month.
 - 3. A supervisor, designated at this time as a rank of Lieutenant, to coordinate and manage the program.
 - 4. The North Area Patrol Station as a location that will be the primary base of operation for the program.
- B. Center School District has agreed to provide the Safe School Program with:

- 1. A leased marked patrol vehicle from the Sacramento Sheriff's Cepartment at the above listed, (A.2.), agreed cost.
- 2. To aquip the Safe School Officer with:
 - a. Safety equipment bag.
 - b. Telephone pager device.
 - c. Cellular telephone.
 - a. One Portable radio which meets Sacramento County Sheriff's specifications.
 - b. One soft-body armor vest.
- 3. To pay Safe School Officers with current off-duty pay rate:
 - le. Rate at this time for deputy sheriff 18 \$21.53 ped hour. ь.
 - Rate at this time for supervising Officer is \$23.05 per hour.
 - c. Overtime will be paid at straight time pay.
- 4. A work schedule will consist of:
 - a. Monday through Friday coverage from 7 a.m. until 4 p.m. with the option to have selected night coverage when needed.
 - b. These hours are subject to change by mutual agreement of both parties.
- 5. Schools to receive service will be:
 - a. Center High School
 - b. Center Junior High School
 - c. McCiellan High School
 - d. Cyril Spinelli Elementary School
 - e. Arthur S. Dudley Elementary School
 - f. North Country Elementary School
 - g. Oak Hill Elementary School

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OPERATION SAFE SCHOOLS N.O.U. BETWEEN SHERIFT'S DEPARTMENT AND C.U.S.D.

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- C. Safe School Officers are responsible for identified critical incidents which occur on campus during school hours. These incidents have been recognized as being disruptive and may endenger students and staff within the schools,
 - 1. Asseults on students or staff on campus,
 - 2. Intruders on campus who are disrupting the school environment,
 - 3. Gang activities on campus.
 - 4. Illegal substance abuse on campus.
- D. All other calls for service which occur on campus or involve students of the district will be referred by the schools to the Sacramento Sheriff's Communications Unit for dispatch to on-duty Sheriff's personnel.
- E. Safe School Officers, while on Safe Schools Patrol, will only be used for non-related school calls at the direction of a Sheriff's Field Supervisor or a Safa Schools Program Administrator.

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IV.

PROGRAM OBJECTIVES

- A. The primary object is to provide immediate response to any school emergency or critical incident that occurs within the designated school campuses of the School District. As such, it shall be the primary responsibility of the School Officer to remain in service, and seek assistance from regular field units in on-going investigations, bookings, and lengthy reporting cases.
- B. The secondary objective is to exemplify pro-active law enforcement involvement with presentations on drug and gang awareness and law enforcement career opportunities.
- C. Deputies will establish a positive police presence with staff and students. Enforcement of violations that occur in the presence of Deputies will be handled in accordance with Sheriff's Department policies and procedures.
- D. To provide a highly visible patrol service that could deter activity that would be disruptive to the school environment of the designated school campuses.

V. Control and Supervision

A. Safe School Officers will remain within the control of the Sacramento Sheriff's Department who will ultimately decide the direction of the Safe School Program.

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OPERATION - SAFE SCHOOLS M.O.U. BETWEEN SHERIFF'S DEPARTMENT AND C.U.S.D.

- B. The Sheriff's Department Safe Schools Program Administrator will by under the direct control of the Chief of Patrol Services or his designee.
- C. Safe School Officers will have indirect supervision from the Departments Safe School Administrator who has ultimate responsibility of all Safe School Officers while they are on assigned Safe School duties.
 - 1. While on duty Safe School Officers will be directly supervised by:
 - a. Designated Team Leader (if applicable)
 - b. Patrol Field Supervisor

VI. EXCLUSIONARY CLAUSE

A. Sacramento County Sheriff's Officers performing services related to the Memorandum of Understanding shall not be considered agents or employees of Center Unified School District and are not entitled to participate in any District pension plans, retirement, health and welfare programs, or any similar programs or benefits, as a result of performing such services.

B. Notwithstanding Paragraph V of the Memorandum of Understanding, the Secremento County Sheriff's Officers performing services related to the Memorandum of Understanding shall be subject to the control or direction of Center Unified School District merely as to the designation of tasks to be performed, and results to be accomplished by the services thereunder, and not as to the means and methods for accomplishing the results.

C. Sacramento County Sheriff's Officers performing services related to the Memorandum of Understanding are not employees of Canter Unified School District for federal or state tax purposes, or for any other purpose. The District shall have no obligation to withhold any payroll taxes from compensation paid to •.

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OPERATION SAFE SCHOOLS M.O.U. BETWEEN SHERIFF'S DEPARTMENT AND C.U.S.D.

> Sacramento County Sheriff's Officers performing services related to the Memorandum of Understanding. The Sacramento County Sheriff's Officers performing services related to the Memorandum of Understanding shell be solely responsible for payment of any tax liability.

> D. The Center Unified School District assumes no liability for workers' compensation, nor liability for loss, damage or injury to persons or property during or relating to the performance of services by Sacramento County Sheriff's Officers related to the Memorandum of Understanding. Such Sheriff's Officers shall be covered under the Sacramento County Sheriff's Department's workers' compensation and liability insurance programs.

> E. Any further changes to the terms and conditions of the Memorandum of Understanding shall be made only in writing executed by both parties.

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OPERATION SAFE SCHOOLS M.O.U. BETWEEN SHERIFF'S DEPARTMENT AND C.U.S.D.

DURATION OF UNDERSTANDING

This Memorandum of Understanding shall begin on July 1, 1998, and remain in effect until such time as either party terminates it by providing thirty (30) days prior written notice to the other party. However, the terms may be changed or updated, as needed, upon agreement of both parties.

III. TERMS AND CONDITIONS

 One marked patrol vehicle to be used by theses selected Deputies. The School District will lease the vehicle from the Sheriff's Department. The cost for the lease of this vehicle is 37 cents per mile, plus a fixed rate of \$300 for the vehicle per month.

All other terms and conditions, and/or provisions of the agreement remain unchanged and in full force and effect.
