Local Control Funding Formula LCFF What Is It? How Will Our Students Benefit?

LCFF

- Local Control Funding Formula
- Replaces cumbersome "Revenue Limit" funding formula
- New funding model puts control of spending at the local level

Revenue Limit Review

- Base amount (by district) * ADA
 Plus Unemployment Adjustment
 Plus PERS Adjustment
- Total was deficited 22.272%
- Additional Restricted Categoricals were awarded separately

Now We Have LCFF

- At full implementation, the LCFF will fund every student at the same base rate within grade spans
- Plus Grade Span Adjustments to the base for:
 - K-3 CSR & Career Technical Ed
 - Add-on of amounts received in 2012/13 for Targeted Instructional Improvement Grant and Transportation
 - Economic Impact Aid is to be used for targeted students

All other noted State categoricals no longer exist

LCFF Additional Award

- The LCFF also provides additional awards to Districts that serve foster youth, English learners, and free/reduced priced meal program students.
 - 20% on behalf of each eligible student (Supplemental Grant)
 - An additional 50% for the eligible students exceeding 55% of total enrollment (Concentration Grant)

How Does It Work

- Base Grant funded per ADA by grade level
 - Plus Grade Span Adjustments for CSR and CTE
 - Plus TIIG and Transportation add-on
- Plus Supplemental Grant
- Plus Concentration Grant

Base Grant

- Funding gap to be closed over an 8-year plan proposed by the Governor
- During fiscal year 13/14 the funding gap was closed 11.78%
- Governor proposed an additional 28% in funding to close the gap in fiscal year 14/15
- Goal is equal base funding Statewide for all students by the end of 2020/2021 fiscal year

Base Grant – At Full Implementation

(Target)

- K 3 funding level \$7,012 per ADA ■ 4 - 6 funding level \$7,117 per ADA ■ 7 – 8 funding level \$7,328 per ADA ■ 9 – 12 funding level \$8,491 per ADA
- 2012/13 Revenue Limit per ADA amount after deficit was \$5,202.69
- Difference between "Target Funding" and current level is call the "Funding Gap"

Grade Span Adjustment

- Per ADA addition for each K 3 student as long as progress is made toward 24:1 class size by 20/21. The amount for 13/14 is \$723.
- Per ADA addition for each 9-12 student for 13/14 is \$219

TIIG & Transportation Add-On

- Targeted Instructional Improvement Grant added to base at the 2012/13 funding level
- Transportation Home to School & Special Education added to base at the 2012/13 funding level

Supplemental Grant

- Additional funds awarded based on the percentage of total enrollment accounted for by English learners, foster youth, and free/reduced priced meals eligible students
- Each student is only counted once
- Counts exceeding 50% of enrollment receive additional 20% of base grant

Concentration Grant

- Additional funds awarded based on the percentage of total enrollment accounted for by English learners, foster youth, and free/reduced priced meals eligible students
- Counts exceeding 55% of enrollment receive additional 50% of base grant

Supplemental & Concentration Calculations

- District data collection reported to State through CALPADS
- Reports number of foster youth, English learners, FRPM counts. Certifies number of unduplicated students. Determines additional awards.
- Additional award to be used provide additional services to targeted students

■ The amount we receive depends on ADA, grade levels of the students and the percentage of gap funding passed in the State budget.

How Do We Budget the \$\$\$\$?

- Base awards, add-on, and grade span adjustments can be used for all District expenses (salaries, books, technology, facilities, etc)
- Supplemental & concentration awards are aimed at serving the students that generated the funds (FRPM, FY, EL)
- What guides this process? The LCAP.

LCAP

- Local Control Accountability Plan
- A Board approved strategic action plan to achieve district goals
- Includes budget amounts allocated to carry out specific actions the District will take to serve students identified in the supplemental and concentration groups

LCAP
