On Item #6 Trustee Pope noted that there was some confusion on this item. She asked Mr. Jordan to clarify what this item is. Mr. Loehr noted that he could give an update on this item. This is a requirement that the state is allowing us to modify. During this distance learning some students may struggle and this would allow us on a case by case basis to allow a student to graduate with less than the state level of requirements. Trustee Hunt noted that this is pretty common with most districts right now; the elective requirement is being reduced to accommodate those that might not have enough credits. He also noted that this has nothing to do with the graduation ceremony.

B. <u>Distance Learning Update, Special Ed Update, and Upcoming Scheduled Events</u>

Mr. Loehr reported again that if there is any way we can hold the upcoming events we will do that. Mr. Jordan congratulated the teachers for what they have accomplished in a short amount of time. He noted that distance learning officially started on Monday. These assignments do count towards grades. We have a hold harmless clause because some students are having a hard time getting online. Moving on to Special Ed, we are meeting with Special Ed teachers as well as an attorney that represents our SELPA and we are keeping up-to-date as we learn how this impacts IDEA and the civil rights in terms of how this works with the special ed population IEPs. We are meeting with the special ed teachers, speech, OTs and others on a weekly basis making sure all of our plans are in place. We are trouble shooting as we can, getting our services out as best as we can. In all of the grades, teachers are working very hard. There have been online class meetings, parades, etc. We are in our first week and

Mr. Loehr noted that once we get farther along, we will be tracking how many students have actually logged in.

Trustee Hunt said good job; Mr. Jordan has led them well. Trustee Anderson complimented Mr. Jordan. Trustee Pope thanked him as well.
