JOB TITLE: Academic Coordinator

DESCRIPTION OF BASIC RESPONSIBILITIES

The Academic Coordinator role will include:

- To be a teacher leader in Situational Roles, as Resource Provider, and as a Data Anaylst;
- To be a catalyst for change as a Professional Learning Designer, Team Facilitator, and Classroom Supporter;
- To be a Quality Learning and Teaching Specialist as a Curriculum Assessor, Assessment Expert, and Instructional Designer.

JOB RESPONSIBILITIES:

- 1. Ensure the grade level curriculum is viable, and delivered according to the state standards.
- 2. Act as the guide to research-based instructional practices that contribute to student achievement.
- Scaffold the development of an effective assessment system based on frequent examination of professional practices through analysis of student work, focused on effective feedback, and designed to support all teachers and students.
- 4. Design on-going, site-based professional development where teachers support each other's growth and focus on the school's unique goals and needs.
- 5. Provide on-going classroom support for teachers and students.
- 6. Provide on-going support outside the classroom, for students struggling with academic achievement.
- 7. Provide support in Student Study Team and IEP meetings.
- 8. Provide on-going support for the Title I program; identify measures to improve student achievement, assist in redefining and realigning program structure and efficiency, analyze data to determine student needs.
- 9. Provide staff development in technology relating to student progress data and curriculum and instruction.
- 10. Duties as assigned as Administrative Designee; including student discipline, classroom walk-throughs and other responsibilities as acting principal.
