JOB TITLE: ESL Teacher (English as a Second Language)

DESCRIPTION OF BASIC RESPONSIBILITIES

Provides a basic bilingual educational program for K-12 students, including limited English proficient students and assists in other school programs as assigned.

TYPICAL DUTIES:

- 1. Plans curriculum and develops goals and objectives for each student according to curriculum and program requirements and the individual student's needs.
- 2. Develops bilingual individual language plans.
- 3. Reviews data submitted on the home language survey.
- 4. Assesses student's English language proficiency.
- 5. Monitors and evaluates student's progress.
- 6. Plan, administer and collect NEP/LEP test data, including pre/post testing.
- 7. Utilizes a variety of materials and methods designed to meet the different learning modes of students.
- 8. May provide language development in the student's primary language, including oral and literacy skills.
- 9. Establishes and maintains standards of pupil behavior needed to achieve effective participation in all activities.
- 10. Instructs student in citizenship, communication skills and other general elements of the course of study specified in state law and administration regulations and procedures of the school district.
- 11. Communicates with parents through a variety of means.
- 12. Holds parent conference to discuss the individual student's progress and interpret the school program.
- 13. Makes home visits.
- 14. Makes community and parent contacts for conferences, guest speakers, study trips and work exploration sites.
- 15. May be assigned to direct and/or supervises classified employees assigned to the program.
- 16. Other related duties as assigned by the Assistant Superintendent and/or the site principal.

- a valid California teaching credential with authorization to teach limited English proficient students, or enrolled in a program leading to an appropriate credential
- a valid California driver's license

Ability to:

- communicate effectively, plan, organize, implement, and coordinate all facets of the Bilingual Education Act
- establish and maintain cooperative and effective working relationships arrive at sound conclusions and recommendations including LEP student data
- evaluate program effectiveness in all areas
