JOB RESPONSIBILITIES:

- 1. Provide on-going support for the Title One program; identify measures to improve student achievement, assist in redefining and realigning program structure and efficiency, analyze data to determine student needs.
- 2. Develop, refine, and monitor implementation of the Title One Plan and the Single Plan for Achievement.
- 3. Ensure the grade level curriculum is viable, and delivered according to the state, district, and school standards.
- 4. Act as the guide to research-based instructional practices that contribute to student achievement.
- 5. Scaffold the development of an effective assessment system based on frequent examination of professional practices through analysis of student work, focused on effective feedback.
- 6. Provide support in 504 and IEP meetings.
