What is the McKinney-Vento Program?

The Student & Family Support Services Department offers assistance and resources to students and families in order to help them navigate the educational system during times of housing instability. This is made possible through the McKinney-Vento Homeless Assistance Act, which provides children and youth experiencing homelessness with rights and services to ensure they receive a quality education.

Who qualifies for the McKinney-Vento Program? and How?

Students experiencing housing instability qualify for McKinney-Vento services.

- Student and Family Support Services asks additional questions based on self-disclosure or a Housing Questionnaire



What can housing instability look like?

- *Staying temporarily with family or friends
- Living in a hotel, car, shelter, or couch-surfing
- Living in unsafe or inadequate conditions
*Due to loss of housing, economic hardship, or a similar reason

What do possible supports include?

- Immediate school enrollment
- *Transportation to school
- Ability to remain at the same school for the entire year
- School supplies and clothing
- Free breakfast and lunch
- Priority access to intersession & after-school programs
- Community recourses
- School support services

*Dependent on circumstance
